

How to Clean Elevate

Performance Fabric with a Soil and Stain Repellent Finish

Recommended Care and Cleaning Guide:

While all stains are not totally removable, the following quidelines are suggested for best results.

- 1. In general, regular vacuuming of upholstered furniture will extend the longevity and beauty of your fabric.
- 2. **Important:** When treating spills, test a small, inconspicuous area of the upholstered furniture to make sure the fabric and color consistency are not affected.*
- 3. Treat spills immediately. Gently blot away the spill with a clean, dry, absorbent cloth. Never rub.
- 4. Removed dried debris with a soft brush or a dull knife and vacuum before using a wet treatment.

Disinfection / Bleach Cleanable:

Clean / Disinfect the soiled area with a 10% solution of household bleach and 90% water. It is important to rinse the cleaned area with fresh water after applying the bleach solution. Wipe dry with a clean cloth.

Cleaning Methods*

- A. Create a water-based mixture consisting of (1) tablespoon of laundry detergent per (2) cups of warm water.

 With a cleansing cloth dampened with this mixture gently blot the spill, never rub. Rotate your cleaning cloth often.

 Afterwards, be sure to gently blot affected area with water to remove all soap residues.
- B. Use a mild chemical based residential upholstery cleaner and follow manufacturers suggested instructions.

*If in doubt, or for severe stains, consult a professional upholstery cleaner.

Spill	Cleaning Method
Fruit, Berries, Wine	A with cold water
Ink	A with rubbing alcohol
Coffee, Chocolate	A with tepid water
Milk, Soft Drinks	A
Grease, Oil, Lipstick	В
Wax	Brush first, then B
Vomit	Lift with cold water sponge, then A
Pencil	B followed by A
Mud, Dried on food	Lift off, vacuum, then A
